If purchased from a dealership the following is needed:

- Bill of Sale from the dealer on their letterhead (Owner is required to have a VIN number and a motor serial number listed on the Bill of Sale.)
Proof of Sales Tax paid (7%)
Original MSO (Manufacturer's Statement of Origin)

If purchased from a private party:

- Notarized Bill of Sale (Owner is required to have a VIN number and a motor serial number listed on the Bill of Sale.)
Proof of Sales Tax Paid (7%)
Copy of Previous Registration (in-state or out-of-state)

## General Information

1. This identification will continue in full force when validated until expiration date (as shown on opposite side) unless sooner terminated or discontinued for cause. This identification will be carried by operator when vehicle is in use.
2. If you lose or destroy your identification number, notify, in writing, the Office of Boat Registration within fifteen (15) days describing the circumstances of the loss or destruction, submitting a new application and a fee is one (\$1.00) dollar for its replacement.
3. The Office of Boat Registration shall be notified in writing and within fifteen (15) days of the transfer of ownership or the destruction or abandonment of any snowmobile or recreational vehicle.
4. No person shall operate a snowmobile or recreational vehicle upon the roadway shoulder or inside bank or slope on any highway in this state or elsewhere within the right of way except as otherwise provided.
5. No person under 16 years of age shall make a direct crossing of a state highway as the operator of a snowmobile or recreational vehicle. A person 16 years of age or older, but less than 18 years of age, may make a direct crossing of a highway only if he has in his immediate possession a valid Motor Vehicle operator's license.
6. No snowmobile or recreational vehicle shall be operated at anytime within the right of way of any interstate highway or freeway within this state.
7. A snowmobile or recreational vehicle may make a direct crossing of a street or highway at any hour of the day provided. A) The crossing is made at an angle of approximately 90 degrees to the direction of the highway where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing, and B) The vehicle is brought to a complete stop before crossing, and C) The driver yields the right of way to all oncoming traffic, and D) In crossing a divided highway the crossing is made only at the intersection of the highway with another public safety street or highway.
8. If crossings are made between the hours of one-half after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise front and rear lights must be on.
