Guidance for Applicants Seeking New Standard Fishing Licenses with Unlimited Finfish Endorsement

2025

As described in the accompanying document entitled *New Standard Fishing License/Endorsement Opportunities Available for 2025*, six (6) new Standard Fishing Licenses with Unlimited Finfish endorsement will be issued in 2025. As further described in the accompanying document, priority will be given to certain applicants for these endorsements. This document provides guidance for applicants seeking the new Standard Fishing License and endorsement, including how to determine if you may qualify for priority status and what you need to do to establish such status and properly submit an application by February 28, 2025. Residents and nonresidents aged eighteen and older who do not qualify for priority status but still wish to obtain the new endorsement are still encouraged to apply (see sections VI and VII below), since there is a chance that non-priority resident and nonresident applicants will be given consideration, pending the outcome of the prioritization process.

Any questions regarding the application process should be directed to DEM's Office of Boat Registration & Licensing at 401-222-6647. All applications & supporting documentation must be mailed, or hand delivered by February 28, 2025 to the DEM, Office of Boat Registration & Licensing 235 Promenade St., Room 360 Providence, RI 02908-5767.

I. Priority Status under Category 1A

Q: Are you a RI resident?

If no, go to section VII below. If yes, proceed to next question.

Q: Have you held a Standard Fishing License (RSTND) with limited finfish endorsement over the past two years – i.e., in 2023 and 2024?

If no, go to section II below. If yes, proceed to the next question.

Q: Have you been actively fishing your Resident Standard Fishing license (RSTND) in the limited finfish sector – i.e., can you demonstrate by dated transaction records that you have sold authorized limited finfish to RI licensed dealers on at least 40 days during 2023 and 2024? [Note: the 40 days of

activity must have spanned both calendar years, meaning that some activity must have occurred in each of the two calendar years.]

If no, go to section II below.

If yes, you qualify for priority status under this category and will be given top consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025, indicating that you wish to obtain a new Standard Fishing license with Unlimited Finfish endorsement. Your application must include a brief cover letter, indicating that you are seeking priority status as an active holder of a RSTND with a limited finfish endorsement. Along with your application, you must submit the dated transaction records necessary to qualify for priority status. Applicants will be ranked based on the length of time they have been actively fishing on a continuous basis, so it is to your advantage to document all of the years that you have been actively fishing your CFL, PEL or RSTND. All transaction records will be subject to verification by the Department in accordance with dealer reports submitted to the Department via the SAFIS reporting system. DEM will disqualify from consideration under this priority category any application that is not accompanied by a sufficient number of valid transaction records.

II. Priority Status under Category 1B

Q: Have you been actively fishing a Resident Standard Fishing License (RSTND) in another Unlimited fishery sector other than finfish over the past two years – i.e., in 2023 and 2024?

If no, go to section III below.

Q: Have you been actively fishing your Resident Standard Fishing License (RSTND) in another Unlimited fishery sector – i.e., can you demonstrate by dated transaction records (and/or verified dockside sales of lobsters or crabs) that you have sold authorized seafood to RI dealers on at least 40 days during 2023 and 2024? [Note: the 40 days of activity must have spanned both calendar years, meaning that some activity must have occurred in each of the two calendar years.]

If yes, you qualify for priority status under this category and will be given top consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025, indicating that you wish to obtain a Standard Fishing License with an Unlimited Finfish endorsement. Your application must include a brief cover letter, indicating that you are seeking priority status as an active RSTND holder, based on your activity over the past two years in any fishery. Along with your application, you must submit the dated transaction records necessary to qualify for priority status. Applicants will be ranked based on the length of time they have been actively fishing on a continuous basis, so it is to your advantage to document all of the years that you have been actively fishing your RSTND. All transaction records will be subject to verification by the Department in accordance with dealer reports submitted to the Department via the SAFIS reporting system (or, with regard to dockside sales of lobsters or crabs, per section 2.7.5 D 1 (2) of the licensing regulations). DEM will disqualify from consideration under this priority category any application that is not accompanied by a sufficient number of valid transaction records.

III. Third Priority Status under Category 1C

Q: Subsequent to your 16th birthday for residents, have you served as a crew member aboard one or more commercial fishing vessels engaged in the finfish fishery?

If no, go to section IV below. If yes, proceed to the next question.

Q: Subsequent to your 16th birthday for residents, have you been actively participating as a crew member – i.e., can you demonstrate via one or more affidavits signed by one or more RI licensed Captains, that you have fished, resulting in RI landings, with that Captain, or those Captains, in the finfish fishery at least 40 days during 2023 and 2024? [Note: the 40 days of activity must have spanned both calendar years, meaning that some activity must have occurred in each of the two calendar years; and all of the activity must have occurred subsequent to your 16th birthday for residents. Please be advised according to the Commercial and Recreational Saltwater Fishing Licensing Regulations, Part 1, Section 1.7 – "Crew"

is defined as an individual, aged (16) or older, employed for purposes of assisting in the operation of a commercial fishing vessel and its gear by another person licensed to fish commercially pursuant to these regulations. Applicants must submit a W2, 1099 or copies of checks or pay stubs for each year worked to validate paid status. Failure to submit any of the required above documents will result in the applicant being excluded from this priority category.

If no, go to section IV below.

If yes, you qualify for priority status under this category and will be given top consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025, indicating that you wish to obtain a Standard Fishing License with an Unlimited Finfish endorsement. Your application must include a brief cover letter, indicating that you are seeking priority status as a resident active crew member, based on your activity in the finfish fishery. Along with your application, you must submit the affidavit(s) necessary to qualify for priority status along with a W2, 1099, or copies of checks or pay stubs for each year worked. Applicants will be ranked based on the length of time, in years, they have been actively participating in the finfish fishery as crew members aged 16 or older for residents, so it is to your advantage to document all of the years that you have been employed in the fishery as a crew member (aged 16 or older, residents,). All applicants must use the blank Department Affidavit forms available from DEM (and posted on the website along with this document). All Affidavits must be signed by licensed Captains and notarized. Licensed Captains must have held a RI CFL, PEL, RSTND, NRSTND or MPURP license during the relevant period. DEM will disqualify from consideration under this priority category any application that is not accompanied by one or more valid Affidavits.

IV. Priority Status under Category 2A

Q: Have you held a RSTND with an Unlimited/Limited Shellfish or Unlimited/Limited crustacean endorsement over the past two years – i.e., in 2023 and 2024?

If no, go to section V below. If yes, proceed to next question.

Q: Have you been actively fishing your RSTND—i.e., can you demonstrate by dated transaction records (and/or verified dockside sales of crabs) that you have sold authorized seafood to RI licensed dealers on at least 40 days during 2023 and 2024? [Note: the 40 days of activity must have spanned both calendar years, meaning that some activity must have occurred in each of the two calendar years.]

If no, go to section V below.

If yes, you qualify for priority status under this category and will be given secondary consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025 indicating that you wish to obtain a new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement. Your application must include a brief cover letter, indicating that you are seeking priority status as an active RSTND holder. Along with your application, you must submit the dated transaction records necessary to qualify for priority status. Applicants will be ranked based on the length of time they have been actively fishing on a continuous basis, so it is to your advantage to document all of the years that you have been actively fishing your RSTND. *All transaction records will be subject to verification by the Department in accordance with dealer reports submitted to the Department via the SAFIS reporting system (or, with regard to dockside sales of lobsters or crabs, per section 2.7.5 D 1 (2) of the licensing regulations). DEM will disqualify from consideration under this priority category any application that is not accompanied by a sufficient number of valid transaction records.*

V. Priority Status under Category 2B

Q: Subsequent to your 16th birthday for residents, have you served as a crew member aboard a commercial fishing vessel engaged in the shellfish and/or lobster (crustacean) fisheries?

If no, go to section VI below. If yes, proceed to the next question.

Q: Subsequent to your 16th birthday, have you been actively participating as a crew member – i.e., can you demonstrate via one or more affidavits signed by one or more RI licensed Captains, that you have fished, resulting in RI landings with that Captain, or those Captains, at least 40 days during 2023 and 2024 in the shellfish and/or lobster (crustacean) fisheries? [Note: the 40 days of activity must have spanned both calendar years, meaning that some activity must have occurred in each of the two calendar years; and all of the activity must have occurred subsequent to your 16th birthday for residents.] Please be advised according to the Commercial and Recreational Saltwater Fishing Licensing Regulations, Part1 Section 1.7 – "Crew" is defined as an individual, aged (16) or older, employed for purposes of assisting in the operation of a commercial fishing vessel and its gear by another person licensed to fish commercially pursuant to these regulations. Applicants must submit a

W2, 1099 or copies of checks or pay stubs for each year worked to validate paid status. Failure to submit any of the required above documents will result in the applicant being excluded from this priority category.

If no, go to section VI below.

If yes, you qualify for priority status under this category and will be given secondary consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025 indicating that you wish to obtain a Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement. Your application must include a brief cover letter, indicating that you are seeking priority status as an active Crewmember, based on your activity in the shellfish and/or lobster (crustacean) fisheries. Along with your application, you must submit the affidavit(s) necessary to qualify for priority status along with a W2, 1099 or copies of checks or pay stubs for each year worked. Applicants will be ranked based on the length of time they have been actively participating as crew members (aged 16 or older, residents), so it is to your advantage to document all of the years that you have been employed as a crew member (aged 16 or older residents). All applicants must use the blank Department Affidavit forms available from DEM (and posted on the website along with this document). All Affidavits must be signed by licensed Captains and notarized. Licensed Captains must have held a RI CFL, PEL, RSTND, NRSTND or MPURP license during the relevant period. DEM will disqualify from consideration under this priority category any application that is not accompanied by one or more valid Affidavits.

VI. Third Priority Status under Category 3

Q: Are you a person that falls under the categories below?

- A. A resident active member of the military (must provide copy of current Military ID#)
- B. A resident military Veteran who has been honorably discharged (must provide form DD-214 or other approved document from RI Department of Veterans Affairs.)
- C. A resident person that holds a valid certificate from an accredited commercial fishing apprenticeship program approved by the Department (Must provide copy of certificate of completion of program.) -

If no, go to section VII below.

If yes, you qualify for priority status under this category and will be given tertiary consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025 indicating that you wish to obtain a Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement. Your application must include a brief cover letter, indicating that you are seeking priority status as an active military, veteran, or accredited apprentice, based on meeting the appropriate qualification above. Along with your application, you must submit either a copy of your current active military ID, or a copy of form DD-214 or other approved document from the RI Department of Veterans Affairs, or a copy of a certificate of completion from a Department approved commercial fishing apprenticeship program to qualify for priority status.

VII. Priority Status under Category 4

Q: Are you a RI resident aged eighteen (18) or older?

If no, go to section VIII below.

If yes, as a RI resident aged 18 or older, you will be given consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. Pursuant to that process, if there are any endorsements remaining after the five priority categories are exhausted, they will be issued, by lottery, if necessary, to resident applicants aged 18 or older who do not qualify for priority status. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025, indicating that you wish to obtain a Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement.

VIII. Priority Status under Category 5

Q: Are you a non-resident of RI aged eighteen (18) or older?

If yes, as a non-resident of RI aged 18 or older, you will be given consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. Pursuant to that process, if there are any endorsements remaining after the above priority categories are exhausted, they will be issued, by lottery, if necessary, to non-resident applicants aged 18 or older who do not qualify for priority status. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025, indicating that you wish to obtain a Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Finfish endorsement.

RI Shellfish Harvester Education & Certification Program

January 2025

DEM launched an education and certification program in 2018 that is mandatory for everyone who commercially harvests and lands shellfish in RI. The goal of the program is to ensure that shellfish harvesters deliver a safe product to shellfish dealers and, in turn, to shellfish consumers. **This course must be completed prior to the issuance of a new shellfish license/endorsement.**

In accordance with US FDA requirements, and new regulations adopted by DEM in 2018, holders of all applicable commercial licenses and landing permits must obtain certification via the new program. Applicants must submit Certificate of Completion prior to license issuance (new applicants only).

The certification requirement applies to:

- All holders of commercial shellfish licenses -- i.e., Standard Fishing Licenses with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement; Over 65 Shellfish Licenses, and Student Shellfish Licenses;
- All holders of Multipurpose Licenses who harvest shellfish; and
- All holders of Landing Permits who land shellfish.

The certification requirement applies to both License/Permit renewals and new Licenses/Permits, beginning in 2018. Certification is valid for 5 years, after which re-certification will be required.

[Note: the 40 days of activity must have spanned both calendar years, meaning that some activity must have occurred in each of the two calendar years; and all of the activity must have occurred subsequent to your 16th birthday for residents.] Please be advised according to the Commercial and Recreational Saltwater Fishing Licensing Regulations, Part 1, Section 1.7 – "Crew" is defined as an individual, aged (16) or older, employed for purposes of assisting in the operation of a commercial fishing vessel and its gear by another person licensed to fish commercially pursuant to these regulations. Applicants must submit a W2, 1099 or copies of checks or pay stubs for each year worked to validate paid status. Failure to submit any of the required above documents will result in the applicant being excluded from this priority category.

If no, go to section IV below.

If yes, you qualify for priority status under this category and will be given top consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025, indicating that you wish to obtain a Standard Fishing License with an Unlimited Shellfish endorsement. Your application must include a brief cover letter, indicating that you are seeking priority status as an active crew member, based on your activity in the shellfish fishery. Along with your application, you must submit the Department Affidavit (s) necessary to qualify for priority status along with a W2, 1099, or copies of checks or pay stubs for each year worked. Applicants will be ranked based on the length of time, in years, they have been actively participating in the shellfish fishery as crew members aged 16 or older for residents so it is to your advantage to document all of the years that you have been employed in the fishery as a crew member (aged 16 or older). All applicants must use the blank Department Affidavit forms available from DEM (and posted on the website along with this document). All Affidavits must be signed by licensed Captains and notarized. Licensed Captains must have held a RI CFL, PEL, RSTND, NRSTND or MPURP license during the relevant period. DEM will disqualify from consideration under this priority category any application that is not accompanied by one or more valid Affidavits.

IV. Priority Status under Category 2A

Q: Have you held a RSTND with a Unlimited/Limited Finfish, Unlimited/Limited Crustacean endorsement over the past two years – i.e., in 2023 and 2024?

If no, go to section V below. If yes, proceed to next question.

Q: Have you been actively fishing your RSTND—i.e., can you demonstrate by dated transaction records (and/or verified dockside sales of crabs) that you have sold authorized seafood to RI licensed dealers on at least 40 days during 2023 and 2024? [Note: the 40 days of activity must have spanned both calendar years, meaning that some activity must have occurred in each of the two calendar years.]

If no, go to section V below.

If yes, you qualify for priority status under this category and will be given secondary consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025 indicating that you wish to obtain a new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement. Your application must include a brief cover letter, indicating that you are seeking priority status as an active RSTND holder. Along with your application, you must submit the dated transaction records necessary to qualify for priority status. Applicants will be ranked based on the length of time they have been actively fishing on a continuous basis, so it is to your advantage to document all of the years that you have been actively fishing your RSTND. *All transaction records will be subject to verification by the Department in accordance with dealer reports submitted to the Department via the SAFIS reporting system (or, with regard to dockside sales of lobsters or crabs, per section 2.7.5 D 1 (2) of the licensing regulations). DEM will disqualify from consideration under this priority category any application that is not accompanied by a sufficient number of valid transaction records.*

V. Priority Status under Category 2B

Q: Are you a resident who subsequent to your 16th birthday have you served as a crew member aboard a commercial fishing vessel engaged in the finfish and/or lobster (crustacean) fisheries?

If no, go to section VI below. If yes, proceed to the next question.

Q: Subsequent to your 16th birthday have you been actively participating as a crew member – i.e., can you demonstrate via one or more affidavits signed by one or more RI licensed Captains, that you have fished, resulting in RI landings with that Captain, or those Captains, at least 40 days during 2023 and 2024 in the finfish and/or lobster (crustacean) fisheries? [Note: the 40 days of activity must have spanned both calendar years, meaning that some activity must have occurred in each of the two calendar years; and all of the activity must have occurred subsequent to your 16th birthday.] Please be advised according to the Commercial and Recreational Saltwater Fishing Licensing Regulations, Part1 Section

1.7 – "Crew" is defined as an individual, aged (16) or older, employed for purposes of assisting in the operation of a commercial fishing vessel and its gear by another person licensed to fish commercially pursuant to these regulations. Applicants must submit a W2, 1099 or copies of checks or pay stubs for each year worked to validate paid status. Failure to submit any of the required above documents will result in the applicant being excluded from this priority category.

If no, go to section VI below.

If yes, you qualify for priority status under this category and will be given secondary consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025 indicating that you wish to obtain a Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement. Your application must include a brief cover letter, indicating that you are seeking priority status as an active crew member, based on your activity in the finfish and/or lobster (crustacean) fisheries. Along with your application, you must submit the Department Affidavit(s) necessary to qualify for priority status along with a W2, 1099 or copies of checks or pay stubs for each year worked. Applicants will be ranked based on the length of time they have been actively participating as crew members (aged 16 or older), so it is to your advantage to document all of the years that you have been employed as a crew member (aged 16 or older residents). All applicants must use the blank Department Affidavit forms available from DEM (and posted on the website along with this document). All Affidavits must be signed by licensed Captain(s) and notarized. Licensed Captain(s) must have held a RI CFL, PEL, RSTND, NRSTND or MPURP license during the relevant period. DEM will disqualify from consideration under this priority category any application that is not accompanied by one or more valid Affidavits.

VI. Priority Status under Category 3

Q: Are you a resident person that falls under the categories below?

- A. A resident active member of the military (must provide current military ID #)
- B. A resident military Veteran who has been honorably discharged (must provide form DD-214 or other approved document from RI Department of Veterans Affairs.)
- C. A resident person that holds a valid certificate from an accredited commercial fishing apprenticeship program approved by the Department (Must provide copy of certificate of completion of program.)

If no, go to section VII below.

If yes, you qualify for priority status under this category and will be given tertiary consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025 indicating that you wish to obtain a Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement. Your application must include a brief cover letter, indicating that you are seeking priority status as an active military, veteran, or accredited apprentice, based on meeting the appropriate qualification above. Along with your application, you must submit either a copy of your current active military ID, or a copy of form DD-214 or other approved document from the RI Department of Veterans Affairs, or a copy of a certificate of completion from a Department approved commercial fishing apprenticeship program to qualify for priority status.

VII. Priority Status under Category 4

Q: Are you a RI resident aged eighteen (18) or older?

If no, you do not qualify for a new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement.

If yes, as a RI resident aged 18 or older, you will be given consideration for the new Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement, in accordance with the selection process delineated in the accompanying document. Pursuant to that process, if there are any endorsements remaining after the above priority categories are exhausted, they will be issued, by lottery if necessary, to resident applicants aged 18 or older who do not qualify for priority status. To be considered, you must submit an application by February 28, 2025, indicating that you wish to obtain a Standard Fishing License with Unlimited Shellfish endorsement.

Taxation Certification Requirements

A new state law, enacted in 2004, requires everyone applying for any license from the state to first certify that they have filed all required state tax returns and paid all taxes due to the State, or entered into a written installment agreement with the Tax Administrator to pay delinquent state taxes. Accordingly, all applicants for new or renewed commercial fishing licenses must first complete one of the following two requirements:

- Sign a Taxation Certification, certifying compliance with all state tax obligations as noted above; the form must also include the applicant's social security number or FEIN, or
- b) Furnish a Letter of Good Standing from the Tax Administrator. (401)574-8941

The Taxation Certification form is available from DEM; it may be completed at the counter while applying for a license or may be filled out online and submitted as part of the online renewal process. Letters of Good Standing must be obtained from the RI Division of Taxation, Collections Division, One Capitol Hill, Providence, RI 02908 (401) 574-8829. **DEM will not issue any new or renewed license until the applicant has submitted a properly completed Taxpayer Affidavit or a Letter of Good Standing.**

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Taxpayer Certification

You are required to furnish your Social Security # or FEIN pursuant to Chapter 76 of Title 5 and Chapter 3 of Title 31 of the RI General Laws, as amended. Any person applying for any license or permit to conduct a business or occupation within Rhode Island or any person renewing a motor vehicle operator's license or motor vehicle registration within Rhode Island must have filed all required state tax returns and paid all taxes due the state or must have entered into a written installment agreement to pay delinquent state taxes that is satisfactory to the Tax Administrator. Failure to provide the Department with your Social Security # or FEIN will result in you having to obtain a Letter of Good Standing from the RI Division of Taxation, One Capitol Hill Providence, RI 02908 **PRIOR** to the issuance or renewal of your license. If you have any questions regarding your tax status, please contact Taxation directly at 401-574-8829
