



Wildlife Rehabilitator Directory

In Rhode Island, wildlife rehabilitation may only be performed by licensed individuals who have the education, skills and training to provide proper care for injured, orphaned or sick wildlife. The following licensed rehabilitators have provided their information to the public to be contacted if a wild animal is thought to need help.

PLEASE NOTE:

- **Wildlife rehabilitators should be consulted first** before any attempt is made to capture, handle or transport wildlife.
- **DO NOT TOUCH ANY RABIES VECTOR SPECIES (RVS):** Raccoons, skunks, foxes, woodchucks or bats.
- If there is any contact with humans or pets, the animal must be euthanized and tested for rabies, as required by state law.
- RI-licensed wildlife rehabilitators may only rehab within Rhode Island and **cannot accept wildlife from out of state.** Animals from surrounding states must go to a rehabilitator within that state.
- The rehabilitation of adult RVS and mute swans (*cygnus olor*) is prohibited in Rhode Island by law.
- This is not a complete list of all RIDEM-licensed Wildlife Rehabilitators in Rhode Island, but rather those who are available to directly assist the public.
