Federal Autobody Refinishing Regulations

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued national regulations to control air emissions from paint stripping and miscellaneous surface coating operations.

If you are the owner or operator of an autobody shop you may be subject to this regulation. It affects those facilities performing paint stripping operations using paint strippers containing Methylene Chloride (MeCl) and those facilities performing a surface coating operation.

Any shop subject to this regulation must submit the "Initial Notification" form to the EPA and a copy to the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management Office of Customer & Technical Assistance before January 11, 2010.
