

BOARD OF CERTIFICATION OF OPERATORS OF WASTEWATER TREATMENT FACILITIES

Meeting Minutes: Wednesday, April 17, 2019

Mr. Patenaude called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m.

Mr. Patenaude proposed that, given the number of issues within the current regulations proposed for evaluation, the Board consolidate those issues and tabulate/schedule them for discussion at forthcoming special regulation meetings. Board members present agreed that this approach would be a helpful means of organizing Board discussions and would assist the regulated community in evaluating said items.

After review, the following items were identified as appropriate for individual Board meetings:

- 1. The definition and understanding of Direct Responsible Charge. This would impact existing definitions of Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent, etc., as well as other areas of the regulations. Mr. Patenaude noted that one recurring theme/question is whether Direct Responsible Charge should be defined as managing staff (as it is currently) or solely overseeing a shift operation, such as a single operator on a third shift (as some have proposed).
- 2. Which duties/labor categories can be licensed at varying levels versus which duties/labor categories would be allowed to attain various licensure levels? Here would arise the discussion on allowing maintenance staff to be licensed at higher levels than are currently allowed.
- 3. Examination and licensure qualifications especially related to education. Of particular interest was the types of "sciences" that might be allowed, such as business or management (which currently are not allowed).
- 4. Expiration dates of both RI/Board exams and the allowance of exams from other jurisdictions. This would, for instance, impact those who take the Grade 3 exam under the "if and when" clause, the passing of which currently expires after two years. (The point has been made that this may be too restrictive.)
- 5. Required retraining for renewal (versus the current "above-and-beyond" voluntary training approach).
- 6. The place of Board "discretion" within the regulation versus strict requirements. This discussion would impact several areas of the current regulations as well as current Board polices.
- 7. Examination protocols especially related to applications, exam delivery, and reviews,

At 3:30 p.m. Mr. McLynch motioned to adjourn. Mr. Schock seconded. All members present voted in favor, as such the motion passed.
