## PART H: ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REOUIREMENTS

#### In addition to the above listed information, the applicant must also provide, along with the application:

- A "Health Certificate" (Certificate of Veterinary Inspection) issued by a federally- accredited veterinarian licensed in the state of origin of the animal. The Health Certificate is to include the results and test dates of any testing that was determined necessary by the Director prior to entry into the state of Rhode Island. The Health Certificate must be as defined in Section 3.6 of the Rhode Island Rules and Regulations Governing Importation and Possession of Wild Animals.
- 2. A signed letter from the Veterinarian listed above (Part G) stating that he/she will provide routine medical care for the animal as well as performing those tests and procedures required by the Department.
- 3. A detailed written description of the manner in which the animal's nutritional, housing and exercise needs will be met as well as any needs specific to the particular species.
- 4. A signed letter from the applicant describing the applicant's experience providing care for animals in general and for this particular species of animal(s) which is the subject of this permit application.
- 5. A signed letter from the Animal Control Officer, or individual in charge of Animal Control, in the municipality where the animal will be housed, stating that there are no municipal ordinances prohibiting ownership of the subject animal(s) in this location.
- 6. The permit application, letter from the veterinarian, and written description must be submitted a minimum of seven (7) days preceding the probable date of shipment.

The Signatory below attests to possess knowledge and understanding of applicable laws, regulations and requirements, governing the proposed activity and in addition releases and holds harmless the Department of Environmental Management and the State of Rhode Island as well as their employees, and agents from liability for any injury, damage, or disease caused by any animal possessed or imported under the permit if issued. Applicant assumes all liability associated with said permit, to include treatment for and prevention of such injury, damage, or disease.

## APPLICABLE RHODE ISLAND GENERAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

Applications for the importation and/or possession of native wild animals shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and other requirements or they shall not be approved. A selection of applicable laws, regulations, and prohibitions is provided below. Please refer to the specific documents for additional information.

#### SELECT PROHIBITIONS (See Rules and Regulations Governing Importation and Possession of Wild Animals for a complete listing)

- 1. <u>Possession of Wild Carnivores</u>: All exotic wild animals and hybrids of the order Carnivora for which there is no USDA conditionally licensed or unconditionally licensed rabies vaccine are expressly prohibited from importation or ownership without the issuance of a valid permit by the Rules and Regulations Governing the Importation and Possession of Wild Animals. Ownership is restricted to bona fide researchers, USDA licensed exhibitors authorized to possess animals of this order, and Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) certified facilities.
- Possession of Native Wildlife: All native wild animals are expressly prohibited from importation or ownership without the issuance of a valid permit by the Department. Ownership is restricted to the Department, the USFWS, AZA certified zoos and aquariums, research institutions and researchers involved in approved bona fide research or project as determined by the Director, and authorized USDA licensed exhibitors.
- 3. <u>Possession of American Bullfrog</u>: The importation or possession of bullfrogs (*Lithobates catesbeianus*) is expressly prohibited, except for flesh that is cooked or frozen and intended for human consumption.
